Genesis 3:15; Galatians 4:4-5

(see also Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:18-25)

(enmity - hostility; hatred)
(seed - something that is sown or planted; offspring)

_____ ▶ According to Genesis 12:1-3 and 22:15-18, what three promises did God make to Abraham?

_____ ▶ Who is the "seed of Abraham" referred to in God's promise?

Deuteronomy 18:15-19; Acts 3:13-26

_____ ▶ God said He would raise up a prophet like unto whom?

True or False ▶ Jesus is the prophet that God promised to raise up.

True or False ▶ Every person must hear *all* things that Jesus says.

Hebrews 9:14; Revelation 1:5

_____ ▶Through the blood of Christ, I can have a clean _____.

True or False ▶The blood of Jesus Christ is what will wash away my sins.

John 6:63, 66-69

True or False ▶Jesus Christ is the one who has the “words of eternal life.”

(*sepulchre - a place for burial; a tomb*)
(*hell - hades, the region of departed spirits*)

Isaiah 53:1-9; Acts 8:26-35

_____ ▶Isaiah prophesied of a man who is referred to as a “man of _____.”

True or False ▶This man was wounded for our transgressions and bruised for our iniquities.

_____ ▶He was brought as a _____ to the slaughter.

True or False ▶Jesus is the “man of sorrows” who was “wounded for our transgressions” and who was “brought as a lamb to the slaughter.”
(*eunuch - one naturally incapacitated for, or voluntarily abstaining from wedlock*)

Psalm 16:8-11; Acts 13:26-38

True or False ▶ God promised that His “Holy One” would not see corruption.

True or False ▶ Jesus is the Holy One who was raised from the dead before his body began to corrupt and decay.

John 1:29-34

True or False ▶ Jesus came as the “Lamb of God” to take away the sin of the world.

True or False ▶ John the Baptist testified that Jesus is the Son of God.

Acts 1:1-3; 2:32; 2 Peter 1:15-18

True or False ▶ No one actually saw Jesus after He was raised from the dead.

(*quickness - the living*)

True or False ▶ Jesus came to improve man’s social status.

Romans 5:8-9; Matthew 26:28

(*justified - to be made free of guilt; innocent*)
(*remission - a dismissal; to send away*)
